



OVERVIEW



UNLOAD

CAUTION

First make sure that the device is in uncocked state.
(-> UNCOCK)

- Hold the handle with one hand and loosen the nut with the other hand.
- Unscrew the nut completely.
- Remove the drum.



Remove the cartridges or empty shell casings from the drum. If necessary, use the ejector to eject the shell cases from the front of the drum.

- Check that all chambers in the drum are empty.

LOAD

- Carry out the steps for unloading.
-  **CAUTION**

Only use the cartridges intended for this device !!!

-



Fill the chambers with the cartridges.

-



Hold the filled drum with one hand and guide the axis of the main unit through the drum with the other hand.

-



Turn the device 180° and put the nut on.
Tighten the nut hand-tight.

COCK

-



Pull the tension lever all the way down and then to the left to the latching position.

UNCOCK

- Hold the cocking lever tightly.
- Pull the cocking lever to the right out of the latching position.
- Slowly escort the cocking lever to the front.
-  **CAUTION**

The tension lever or spring is under high tension. Make sure that you hold the cocking lever firmly and that the spring is not released uncontrolled. This would cause the cartridge to fire if there is still a cartridge in the chamber!

FIRE

-



Turn the drum onto a loaded chamber and make sure it is securely engaged!

- Keep the device away from your body in a safe direction.

-  **CAUTION**

"Make sure your finger or any part of your body is NOT in front of the drum to avoid escaping gas!"

-



Use your thumb to push the cocking lever to the right until it jumps out of the locking position and fires the cartridge.

-  **CAUTION**

Never dry fire -> Never "fire" without a cartridge in the chamber because this will damage the firing pin and the drum!

CLEANING

Clean the device after each use.

Use gun oil and a cloth or a soft brass or plastic brush to clean the drum and nut.

REPAIRS

A device that does not function properly can be dangerous. Do not attempt to repair the device yourself, incorrect assembly can lead to dangerous malfunctions.



CAUTION

Have the unit inspected and repaired only by an authorized specialist dealer or gunsmith!
